

Colorado Mountain College Placement Test Quick Reference Guide 2018-2019

Valid 18/FA, 19/SP, 19/SU

Restrictions:

Test scores are valid for 5 years.

Courses are valid for 10 years, must be from a regionally accredited institution (some courses allow less time).

Exemptions:

ACT Reading Score 17, SAT Reading Score 430: Exempts student from taking the Reading Comprehension portion of the Accuplacer

ACT Writing Score 18, SAT Writing Score 440: Exempts students from taking the Sentence Skills portion of the Accuplacer

NOTE: Students with ACT/SAT scores equivalent to courses less than 100-level (college-level) must take the Accuplacer.

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How to Meet Assessment Requirements:

1. For placement, if a student already has both W (Writing) and R (Reading Comprehension) scores that places them in different levels, and if the student is *first time enrolling in college* and hasn't taken other approved ENG/RDG courses, then the lowest of the two scores will determine placement.
2. If students have been enrolled in college and have tested into Dev Ed courses but haven't taken any Dev Ed courses yet, the Sentence Skills or Writing (W) scores should be used to determine placement.
3. Students who have successfully passed, with a C- or better, any 100 level course in the four discipline strands (Communication, Arts & Humanities, Social Sciences, or Science) will have also completed their College-level Composition & Reading (CCR) developmental English course requirements.
4. **NOTE:** ACT, SAT, and Accuplacer must be no more than five years old.
