This is a classical drawing class where you will learn to draw accurately what you see in a step by step, easily understood method. Students will be introduced to lines of sight, the grid method, viewing positive and negative space, measuring proportions, free-hand perspective, design elements and composition. Emphasis will be on technique rather than on personal expression. Subject matter will be limited to a variety of still-life subjects but the skills can be applied to drawing figures or other subject matter. Students should plan on attending all class meetings for maximum learning. Materials needed: 18 X 24 lightweight paper (50 to 80lb) 2B pencils, erasers and a ruler.

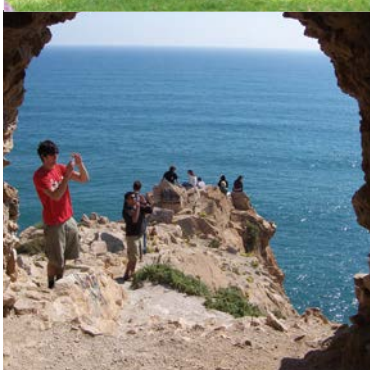

It's important to us that you're in the right class. Many courses require placement testing prior to enrollment. Accuplacer quickly assesses students over the internet in the skill areas of Reading, Writing and Math to determine proper placement into college level courses. Students can utilize online resources for preparation and then schedule a test time by calling the front office at any CMC location.
